WIC Programs are Going Electronic

Piedmont Health Services is excited to announce that eWIC, a new system in which WIC participants will be issued electronic benefit transfer (EBT) cards instead of paper vouchers is coming to local residents. Starting in mid-March, WIC participants in central North Carolina can begin using eWIC cards at stores where they are accepted to access their benefits, once they have established a PIN.

WIC participants can visit www.mybnft.com to easily establish their PIN. This change has already been implemented in several states and is now occurring across North Carolina.

Women, Infants, and Children (WIC), a supplemental nutrition program providing healthy food and education at no cost to eligible participants, has helped support families across the nation for decades. This new benefit transfer method has a number of benefits:

The cards function similarly to credit, debit, and food stamp cards. Rather than dealing with multiple paper vouchers at the supermarket checkout line, participants can instead use their cards. WIC participants will be able to easily check their eWIC balance, purchase history, access the shopping guide, and more by using the Bnft app, or by visiting www.mybnft.com.

- The cards are replaceable if lost. (Participants can replace cards by visiting their local WIC office, listed below or calling the eWIC customer service system at 1-844-230-0813.)
- The eWIC system reduces error, allows for greater flexibility and freedom, and makes the shopping experience quicker and more convenient for participants and vendors.

Studies have shown that transition to eWIC increases the number of redeemed vouchers by WIC participants. Researchers also have found that eWIC cards are preferred by vendors and participants, and allow for additional data analysis to reveal trends and patterns.
